Please note that

i) Consent to this journey/visit implies consent to any emergency medical treatment that may become necessary. While the teacher(s) in charge will do everything possible to get in touch with you in the event of illness or accident, circumstances may dictate that they have to use their own judgement about emergency medical treatment.

ii) Under the terms of the 1998 Education Reform Act (Charging for Educational Activities in School Time), an educational visit, which takes place principally in school time, may not be subject to compulsory charges. Parents may, however, make a voluntary contribution to cover the cost of the trip provided that no pupil is excluded whose parents are unwilling to pay. Should a parent choose to exercise that legal right the pupil's costs must be borne by the school from other funds. If the School will not, or cannot do this, the trip may be cancelled. Inability to pay is quite a different matter about which the Headteacher should be contacted confidentially.
